You can claim a Personal Development Credit for every approved course, however only one will count towards your graduation total.

FAQs

1. What is the High School Credit Program?

The High School Credit Program is an opportunity for cadets to receive High School credit for the training they receive at Cadet Training Centres. The Province of Nova Scotia recognizes the valuable leadership skills that are gained through this training and will award students with a Personal Development Credit on their transcript.

2. Why should I claim my Personal Development Credits?

One Personal Development Credit claimed through Cadet Summer Training may be counted towards the five elective credits required for graduation. Cadets are encouraged to claim all eligible courses as they will appear on their official school transcript for future employment and entrance into post-secondary institutions.

3. How do I claim my Personal Development credits?

To claim a Personal Development Credit, provide your school Guidance Counselor with:

- (1) a **signed copy** of your course report for one of the approved courses, and
- (2) the **Personal Development Credit – Student Application Form** on the reverse of this brochure (also available at <https://pdc.ednet.ns.ca/policy-guides-forms>).
